Dear Sir,

I was duly favoured with your letter of the 15th ultimo, enclosing a report of a Survey held by a Surveyor, appointed by your goodself on the S.S. "TAFFARI" ex "WAR MYSTERY", and beg to express to you the thanks of the Committee for your very kind attention in this matter. I may say, that the Owners are being informed that the vessel has been allowed to remain as "classed" upon this report without ^{cord} report of Survey, subject to an efficient hand pump being fitted in No.1 hold as proposed and 15 fathoms of stream chain being supplied at the first opportunity, and to the ballast suction being removed from the fore and after peak tanks and the deep tank.

I may say, that I am furnishing Mr. Dewar Paton, the Society's Surveyor at Algiers, with the details of this case, as I assume that by the time this letter reaches you, he will have arrived and taken up his duties, and in the
