With reference to your letter of the 15th instant, enclosing cheque for £113. 15. 0 in settlement of the account for the fees for the survey during construction of the Ferro-Concrete Motor Auxiliary Schooner "VIOLETTE", I now beg to hand you herewith the official receipt for the amount in question.

With regard to the question you raise respecting the amount of the fees and expenses in this case, I have to point out that in view of the distance that Faversham is from London, and the number of visits which it has been necessary for the Surveyor to make, it is thought that the expenses are not in any way excessive.
