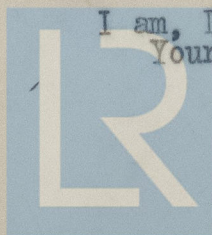
Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th instant, with reference to your Ferro-Concrete Auxiliary Schooner "VIOLETTE", and to acquaint you that the Committee have had before them today a report from the Society's Surveyors of an examination made of the vessel while in the Britannia Dry Dock, Millwall, after having sustained damage by striking Southend Pier and subsequent beaching, and that in all the circumstances the Committee feel that this is a case in which a record of the casualty should now be made in the Society's Register Book.

They have accordingly recommended for the consideration of the General Committee of the Society on Thursday next that a record of "In port - Damaged 1,21" be inserted in the Register Book against the vessel's name, and in accordance with the usual practice the vessel's class would at the same time be expunged from the Book.
