

Crossley Brothers of Openshaw, Manchester on March 12th and subsequent dates 1917 for the purpose of inspecting, during construction, portions of the Machinery intended to be fitted on board the "Mersey" class Admiralty Trawler being built by Messrs. Cochrane & Co of Selby their Ship N^o. being 821 and Eng. N^o. C 16.

The main Engines & pumps driven by them together with the Screw & intermediate shafts, Thrust block & stern tube have been well constructed in accordance with the plans & specification, the material used having been satisfactorily tested to the rule requirements of Lloyd's Register of Shipping.
