U-Boat Torpedoes
Another Neutral

CORUNNA, Sunday.—Three fishing-boats have arrived here with 18 survivors of the Panamanian ship Santa Margarita, belonging to the Primera Compania de Navegacion of Panama, which was torpedoed by a U-boat off the coast last Tuesday. Twenty-one of the crew are missing. The crew were mostly Yugo-Slavs and Maltese. —Associated Press.

SANTA MARGARITA.—Corunna, July 7. —Eighteen members of crew of Panamanian steamer Santa Margarita, sunk on July 2, rescued and landed here by local trawlers Lourdes and Rita Esperanza. Another boat with 21 men still missing.
