I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th inst. respecting the wire hawsers proposed to be supplied to the "Ss Keweenaw," Messrs Workman Clark & Co's No 183, and beg to inform you that the only apparent difference between these hawsers and those supplied by Messrs Bullivant & Co, which are of the required strength, per Table 22, is that the separate wires composing the strands are larger in diameter in the case of the hawsers in question, and consequently fewer in number.

I have communicated with Messrs Workman Clark & Co, asking


