NATENNA.—*London, March 9.*—Following telegrams received March 9:—(1) Wilson wires following:—Steamer Natenna in distress having lost rudder and leaking badly. Tugs sent to shelter her alongside breakwater, but owing to heavy seas operation very difficult. (2) Wilson wires following:—Steamer Natenna: Owing to flooding of engine-room and heavy seas towing was unsuccessful and steamer drifted ashore on rocks stern to sea. Is considered total loss. Part of crew landed, but Master, Chief Mate, Chief Engineer and probably four men still aboard. Will try rescue at low tide to-night 10 o'clock. Cargo landed before accident amounted about 90 tons.
