claimed to have been caused by heavy weather between the 31st January  
and the 2nd February 1920 while on the voyage from Swansea to Casablanca  
and that <sup>we</sup> ~~I~~ have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's  
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all <sup>temporary</sup> repairs  
recommended by <sup>us</sup> ~~me~~ have been completed to <sup>our</sup> ~~my~~ satisfaction, and  
that <sup>we</sup> ~~I~~ have Recommended that she be continued as classed  
+10A-, without fresh record of survey, subject to further examination  
in a dry dock at a port on the Gulf of Mexico or Norfolk Va... on her  
arrival there, directly after the present voyage to ports in Morocco,  
being fit to carry her present cargo of coal to her ports of destination  
in Morocco and proceed in ballast condition to a port in the Gulf  
of Mexico or Norfolk Va....
