SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

RIVER MEANDER (s).—Halifax (N.S.) (by Cable received Dec. 2).—Steamer Ikkal arrived with crew steamer River Meander (formerly Bardistan), bound Smyrna, reported foundered 300 miles off Halifax.
 London, Dec. 2.—An Exchange telegram dated Halifax (N.S.), Dec. 1, states:—British steamer River Meander, which sailed from New York for Naples on Nov. 26, has been found abandoned at sea, in a sinking condition. The master and crew of 30 were rescued during a terrific gale by Ikkal (s), Galveston for Liverpool, which landed them here to-night.
 Halifax (N.S.) (by Cable received Dec. 2).—Steamer Ikkal arrived with 31 crew steamer River Meander, foundered at sea.
