**RIVER MEANDER** (s).—*Halifax (N.S.)* (by Cable received Dec. 2).—Steamer *Ikbai* arrived with crew steamer *River Meander* (formerly *Bardistan*), bound *Smyrna*, reported foundered 300 miles off *Halifax*.

*London, Dec. 2.*—An Exchange telegram dated *Halifax (N.S.)*, Dec. 1, states:—British steamer *River Meander*, which sailed from *New York* for *Naples* on Nov. 26, has been found abandoned at sea, in a sinking condition. The master and crew of 30 were rescued during a terrific gale by *Ikbai* (s), *Galveston* for *Liverpool*, which landed them here to-night.

*Halifax (N.S.)* (by Cable received Dec. 2).—Steamer *Ikbai* arrived with 31 crew steamer *River Meander*, foundered at sea.
