The 2nd S.S. No.3 became due 7,32 and no part of the survey has been held.

The vessel being laid up the usual undertaking has been furnished.

The case received consideration in August 1934 when it was decided not to ask the Owners to carry out a general examination although the Special Survey was then 2 years overdue.

In reply to enquiry the Secretary to the Liverpool Committee writes he has been informed that the vessel is still laid up.

The year of grace expired 7,33.

It is submitted for consideration whether in view of the fact that the Special Survey is now 3 years overdue the Owners should be asked to arrange for the vessel to be generally examined.
