Work placed along the shipway. Bottom & rudder cleaned, examined, & repaired.

Found stem bar slightly out of alignment in way of Collision. The riveting & caulking in way of this has been overhauled. The Owners do not desire to discontinue the stem & this proposal in my opinion merits the favourable consideration of the Committee. The vessel is in good seaworthy condition.
