—A survivor of the Dutch steamer Stad Schiedam, blown up at sea, has stated in hospital that the vessel was sunk by a bomb planted among the cargo. Twelve survivors, who have been landed here, were picked up by the British steamer White Crest after being adrift on a raft for five days.—Reuter.
