Nature of Survey

Common Damage

The Algiers' Surveyor reported in April last this vessel had sustained damage to plating through striking Quay wall.

Temporary repairs were effected, and the Surveyor recommended the damaged plating be examined at the next dry docking.

The Newcastle Surveyors now report the vessel has been placed in dry dock, the bottom cleaned, examined & recoated, and the rudder rebushed.

The caulking & riveting in way of five indented shell plates have been overhauled, and the Surveyors recommend the indented plates be faired at Owners' convenience.

It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed, with fresh record of Survey, subject to the indented plates being faired at Owners' convenience.
