That night (Saturday) Rotterdam was an awe-inspiring sight. The whole of the Old Town was ablaze, including all the banks and business offices on the river front. The Maas Station, too, was burning, and the close-packed shipping offices on the western half of the island. Crackling flames leaped up from the doomed Statendam. The rest of the town lay as quiet as a graveyard, but roofs, church-spires, and the new-style skyscrapers were lit up with an unearthly glow.


