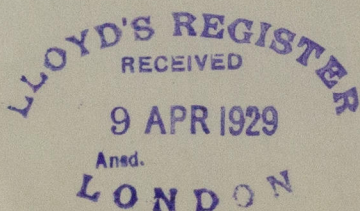

Dear Sir,

We beg to confirm telegram sent you to-day as follows:-

"STATENDAM UPPER PROMENADE SHEERSTRAKE ONE POINT OUGHT
FOUR INCHES WITH FIFTEEN BY POINT NINE DOUBLING AS
APPROVED"

In explanation it may be stated that the Builders
furnished a quarter scale sketch of the Midship Section showing
the scantlings and arrangements of the vessel as built. On
inquiry to-day it was found that the thickness of the upperstrake
promenade sheerstrake was 1.04" instead of .98" as shown on the
Builders' plan.
