I am in receipt of your letter of the 28th instant, with enclosures, respecting Messrs. Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson's Yard Nos. 1580 and 1582, and have to acquaint you that the remarks contained in the Firm's letter of the 27th instant regarding the mixing steam connections on the main boilers have been noted, and it is considered their proposal to blank off the branches on the auxiliary stop valves and make the mixing steam connections direct to the boilers merits approval.

Further, in view of the short time available for the Company to obtain valves having straight inlet branches, their proposal to connect the existing mixing steam valves to the boiler shells by means of cast steel bends of strong and rigid construction is considered satisfactory.

The plan, Tracing No. 15432, showing the proposed amendments will also be approved, and two copies are returned herewith.
