marked as below, have been surveyed during construction by the undersigned.
The material has been tested by the Surveyors to Lloyd's Register; the scantlings
in accordance with the Society's Rules for a working pressure of 180 lbs.
square inch, and the workmanship is good. The Boilers having been
tested in my presence on the 3rd April 1914 by hydraulic pressure
360 lbs. per square inch, showed no signs of weakness, and were
found tight and sound in every respect at that pressure. Working pressure
to exceed One hundred and eighty lbs. per square inch.
