Dear Sirs,

With reference to your Report No. 29653 on the Steamer "FRENCH ROSE", I have to acquaint you that a letter was recently received from the Owners intimating that the Vessel was trading to Dover for the Admiralty, and in the circumstances, the Society's Surveyor at that Port was requested to give the matter of the anchor his attention. He now writes, however, to say that the Steamer has apparently ceased to trade at his Port, and he understands she is at present at Coole.

In the circumstances, I shall be glad to learn what further arrangements have been made, with a view to the equipment being placed in order.

You will observe that the Vessel's Screw Shaft became due for Survey at the end of May last.
