

Steel S.S. "TIMAVO" ex OMBLA".

This vessel has been built at Trieste by the Cantiere San Rocco, for local Owners.


She was commenced in July 1914, was launched on the 15th December 1917, and has recently been completed (last date of survey, 11th November 1920).

The Surveyor states that the vessel has been moored at the Builders' Yard from the day she was launched and has been well looked after. On the 17th February 1918 she broke adrift during a gale of wind and stranded on a breakwater, sustaining some damage on the starboard bilge. She was placed in dry dock at Monfalcone in August 1920, when the bottom and rudder were examined and repairs to the shell and framing carried out. Ten shell plates, eight wing brackets, and starboard bilge keel were satisfactorily dealt with. The general condition of the bottom and rudder was found to be quite satisfactory.

In the circumstances, as the vessel appears to have been carefully attended to during the war, and has throughout been under the supervision of the Society's Surveyors, who recently examined her, as mentioned above, it is submitted that the Date of Build in this case might be recorded as AUGUST 1920, as approved by the General Committee in previous similar cases.
