Nature of Survey

S.S. No. 1

The class of this vessel is subject to some buckled shell plating being repaired at the first favourable opportunity.

The S.S. No. 1 has now been held, and the following repairs done due to wear and tear:-

Bottom coated. Minor repairs effected.

The repairing the the plates referred to above has been deferred to meet the Owners' convenience.

Alterations to meet Admiralty requirements.

This vessel was originally built with a view to the carriage of oil fuel in the water ballast tanks and has now been specially prepared for that service. All water ballast tanks have been tested to the level of the weather decks & a fuel oil pumping system installed and all Rule requirements duly complied with.

It is submitted the vessel is worthy to remain as classed, with record of Survey 10. 16 and notation of S.S. Cff No. 1. 16 as recommended.
