We request that the Committee of Lloyd's Register will instruct the Society's Surveyors to Specially Survey during Construction the Hull, Engines and Boilers of the Vessel No. 914 building by Messrs. A. G. Hieser, Bremen for Messrs. Aktiebolaget Reserwa, Stockholm of ca 18000 Gr. Reg. Tons. Length 182,877 m Breadth 24,384 m, Depth 16,764 m intended to be Classed Lloyd's Register + 100 A1 full scantling vessel.

We undertake to arrange for every facility to be given to the Surveyors to carry out the duty in question, and we agree to pay the fees for the Surveyors' services, in addition to the actual travelling and other expenses incurred by the Surveyors in connection therewith.

This request is made upon the terms of the Rules and Regulations of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, which provide that:—
