TWO NAVAL TRAWLERS SUNK

An official Admiralty communique states: "The Board of Admiralty regrets to announce that H.M. trawlers Velia (Temporary Probationary Sub-Lieutenant L. J. G. Shoo-bridge, R.N.V.R.), and Lord Stamp (Chief Skipper J. D. Mackay, R.N.R.) have been sunk by enemy mines. The next of kin of casualties have been informed."

The Velia, of 290 tons gross, was formerly owned by J. Marr & Son, Ltd., of Fleetwood, and the Lord Stamp, of 448 tons gross, by Pickering & Haldane's Steam Trawling Company, Ltd., of Hull.
