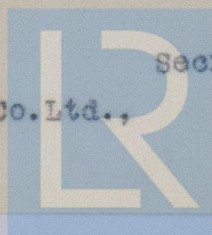
With regard to this case I have to remind you that the sketch of midship section submitted for the approval of the Committee showed that ceiling was to be fitted on the tank top under the hatches only, and that the sketch was approved with this arrangement.

In these circumstances it is felt that the proposal now made to dispense with the ceiling can only be approved with the consent of the Owners of the vessel, and I have therefore to ask you to kindly be so good as to arrange for this to be forwarded.
