CRAIGFORTH. Leith, Aug. 7.—The British steamer Craigforth has been beached off Buyukdere, in the Bosphorus, 11 miles from Constantinople, after having struck a mine.—Lloyd's.

CRAIGFORTH.—Constantinople, Aug. 14.—Steamer Craigforth refloated.
London, Aug. 23.—Telegram from Copenhagen, dated Aug. 21, states:—Salvage steamer Danmark arrived Constantinople with steamer Craigforth. Now discharging damaged cargo.

Date of Casualty

Précis of particulars of Casualty

Vessel was beached after striking a mine, 11 miles from Constantinople, on 7th Aug. 1914.

She was refloated & taken to Constantinople where temporary repairs were effected under the supervision of the Societys Surveyor. Her report was before the Committee on 16th Oct. 1914, when the case was deferred for permanent repairs.

The vessel was detained at Constantinople on account of the closing of the Dardanelles.

The vessel's register has now been closed at the Customhouse with the notation "Seized by Turks 30.10.14"

In these circumstances it is thought well to again submit the case for the Committee's consideration.
