Stranding

The notation of S S No 3 was assigned to this vessel in March 05 subject to steam & keel anchors of proper weight & being supplied.

The Sydney Surveyor now reports that he has examined the vessel in dry dock after stranding & the bottom found injured has been cleaned & coated.

It is submitted the vessel might be allowed to remain as cleared, record of Survey being deferred for completion of equipment.

The vessel has since been reported to have been wrecked & become a Total loss.
