The "AGINCOURT" arrived in this Port on the 6th. inst., and reported stranding at Astoria, Portland Oregon on Nov. 24th. 1905., the following particulars of which I obtain from the Log-book.

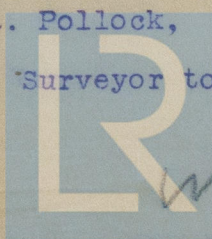
"Left Astoria Nov. 24th, 1905. for Japanese ports, Pilot in charge, 10 a.m. in crossing the Bar ship took the bottom twice in quick succession, 10.20 bumped heavily, sounded pumps and wells, making no water, no apparent damage, proceeded on voyage, arriving at Sydney as above".

The "AGINCOURT" floated into Woolwich Dock on the 7th. inst. where I examined the Hull outside with the exception that the paint was off the flat of the bottom she had sustained no damage by the stranding, from Keel to water line was well coated with paint, and the "AGINCOURT" floated out of Dock this morning.

I certify that all repairs recommended by me have been carried out to my satisfaction.
