*Surveyed the steel screw "ILVINGTON COURT", 5187 tons gross,*

*of London, whilst lying afloat in the Roath Dock, Cardiff, on the 10th. July, 1940, on account of slight leakage in way of shell frame, port side of No. 4 hold, stated to have developed during heavy weather on the 28th. June, 1940, voyage Pepel to Cardiff, -----*

*and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all <sup>temporary</sup> repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and*

*that I have **Recommended** that she be retained as classed without fresh record of survey, subject to permanent repairs being effected to riveting of second shell frame from aft in No. 4 lower hold (port side) at Owners' earliest convenience.*

*being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.*

*The vessel's class is also subject to permanent repairs to PP structure and stokehold watertight bulkhead at S.S. (or further examination when S.S. due).*
