
I am in receipt of your letter of the 28th ultimo relative to the steamer "JACOBUS", and in compliance with your request I enclose herewith an assignment letter setting forth the timber freeboards assigned to this ship together with the ordinary cargo freeboards.

In this connexion I have to acquaint you that the conditions of assignment for ordinary freeboards were complied with at Barry and Fowey in November and December last with the exception of the following:-

1. The cross bunker and coal shoot hatchways on the casing top to have battening arrangements and coamings reasonably in accordance with the Convention requirements.
2. The coal hatchways in the bridge space being reasonably in accordance with the Convention requirements.

In reply to enquiry as to when these items would be attended to, the Owners wrote on the 5th December that they had already been complied with, but no report on the same has been received at this Office.

I shall therefore be glad if you will verify that these items are now in order and I may add that there are no conditions attached to the timber freeboard assignment.
