M. I think it well to inform you that freeboard verification forms have been received from the Baltimore Surveyor, giving the freeboards assigned under the U.S. Regulations by the American Bureau in respect of the steamers "MUNDIXIE" and "W.W. BRUCE". Freeboard is not a condition of the classification of these vessels, and the records of freeboard and draught are therefore being expunged from the Register Book.

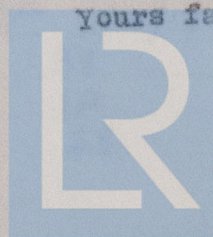
In addition a similar form has also been received from the Newport News Surveyor intimating the freeboards assigned by the American Bureau to the steamer "JAMES MC GEE". These freeboards are the minimum permitted by the U.S. Regulations, and are being accepted as complying with the conditions of classification of the vessel, and the records in the Register Book are being amended accordingly.
