Holyhead with the steamer "GLAUCUS" in dense fog
on the 2nd August, 1945.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

BLUSH ROSE. London, Aug. 3. The following wireless messages have been received from steamer GLAUCUS: At 11 30 p.m., G.M.T., Aug. 2: S.O.S. position lat. 53 26 30 N., long. 5 5 W., collision with Blush Rose (steamer Blush Rose). Latter vessel sunk. Dense fog, rescuing survivors, returning to Liverpool.
At 12 30 a.m., G.M.T., Aug. 3: All crew of Blush Rose (Blush Rose) rescued, no injuries. GLAUCUS has no apparent damage. Suggest making Holyhead to land survivors when fog clears.

BLUSH ROSE. Holyhead, Aug. 3. District Staff Officer, Liverpool, reports British steamer GLAUCUS having sunk British steamer Blush Rose in collision 20 miles off Holyhead; crew saved. GLAUCUS making for Holyhead with survivors when fog lifts. (See issue of Aug. 4.)
London, Aug. 4. British steamer GLAUCUS reached Holyhead early to-day. She had on board 15 members of the crew of the British steamer Blush Rose.


