With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the steamer "THE VICEROY," which is reported to have been sunk by mine near Flushing on the 12th ultimo, I am directed to say that the Committee will be much obliged if you will kindly favour them with the latest information which you have received as to the extent of damage, prospects of salvage, &c.

The question of making a record of the casualty against the vessel's name in the Register Book will shortly come under the Committee's notice, and it is the practice, in cases where it is thought necessary to make such a notation, to expunge at the same time the vessel's class from the Register Book.

I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly apprise me for the Committee's information, of any remarks you may care to offer in regard to this case.
