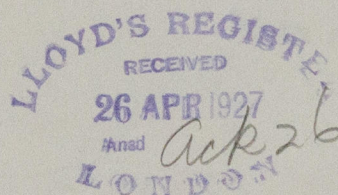

With reference to your letter of 19th. instant, regarding particulars required in connection with the freeboard assignment, we beg to inform you that in response to several enquiries from ourselves, the Owners' Local Agents had promised to arrange with the Captain for facilities to be afforded for the required examination to be made, but they advised us this morning that the vessel will be proceeding to sea today and that it will not be possible for the matter to receive attention upon this occasion.

They add that the Captain has not received any instructions from his Owners on the subject and that the vessel is proceeding to Bordeaux and Bilbao, returning either to Middlesbrough or the Tyne.

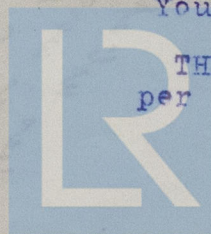
