REPAIRS TO ENGINES AND BOILERS DUE TO DAMAGE THROUGH-

The class of this tanker was omitted from the Register Book in 1944 as she was then in enemy occupied country.

The Rotterdam Surveyors report the machinery has been opened up throughout and found or placed in good condition.

War damage repairs:- All of the machinery was removed from this vessel, crank shaft skimmed up, all bearings remetalled and all auxiliary engines and pumps, parts of which have been renewed, have been overhauled.

The electrical installation has been completely rewired in accordance with the Rules and satisfactorily tested.

The following spare parts, namely, propeller, main engine piston, main engine crank pin bearing and fuel pump parts for both auxiliary engines have not yet been supplied. These parts have been ordered and will be placed on board immediately they are received.

IT IS SUBMITTED that this vessel is eligible for the Record LMC 7.47, S 4.47, DBS 6.47, subject to the spare gear being placed in order.

It is concluded the Steam papers have been looked on satisfactorily examined but this should be confirmed.
