I am in receipt of Mr. Gunner's letter of the 30th ultimo and return herewith as desired the request form No. 4 filled in by the Owners for the survey of the steamer "PUNGUE", with a view to classification in the Register Book.

The result of your preliminary examination is noted, and with regard thereto I have to say that it must be clearly understood that the requirements necessary for the classification of the vessel can be determined only after the scantlings of the vessel and her boilers, etc. have been examined in this Office. For this purpose plans should be forwarded with the least possible delay, and if no plans are available, particulars of the scantlings must be taken and forwarded on a first entry report form, and I shall be glad if you will inform the Owners to this effect.

It is not quite clear from your letter whether the survey for classification is intended to be proceeded with during the time the vessel is laid up, and I shall be glad to hear from you on this point.
