being fit to carry petroleum in bulk.

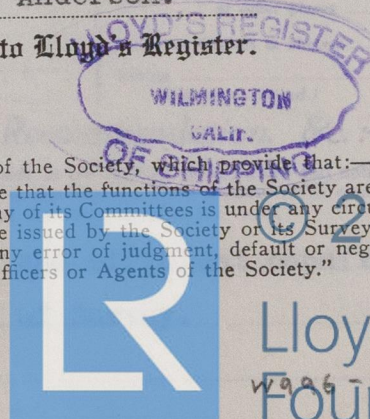
