REPORT OF ANNUAL LOAD LINE INSPECTION

PORT OF LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIADATE March 31st, 1944

THIS IS TO CERTIFY that the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of The Texas Company, Principal Sub-Agents for U.S. Maritime Commission, attend the S.S. "PENNSYLVANIA" Official Number 215286 of Wilmington, Del., at Los Angeles Harbor, California on the 31st day of March 1944, for the purpose of inspecting (a) protection of openings, (b) guard rails, (c) freeing ports, (d) means of access to crew's quarters, and found same to have been maintained in an effective condition; also, that no alterations had been made to hull or superstructures which would affect the calculations determining the position of the load lines.

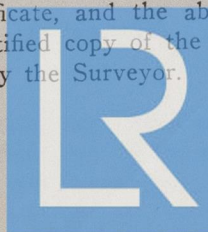
