(a) protection of openings, (b) guard rails, (c) freeing ports, (d) means of access to crew's quarters, and found same to have been maintained in an effective condition; also, that no alterations had been made to hull or superstructures which would affect the calculations determining the position of the load lines.

Coastwise Load Lines as assigned under the amendment of the 3rd July, 1941, to the Coastwise Load Line Act, have now been marked on the vessel's sides and verified by me.


