STEWART" Official Number 214951 of Wilmington, Del. at Robins Dry Dock & Repair Co., on the 5th day of September, 1933, for the purpose of inspecting (a) protection of openings, (b) guard rails, (c) freeing ports, (d) means of access to crew's quarters, and found same to have been maintained in an effective condition; also, that no alterations had been made to hull or superstructures which would affect the calculations determining the position of the load lines.


