Sir

In reply to yours of the 25th inst,
I have to inform you that it is usually adopted
here by the owners of new vessels of this
built, to take about 4 inches breadth of plank
Rout of Seiling all fore & aft on both sides
in fore hold, & between decks, for the pur-
pose of placing & filling up with rock salt,
for the preservation of the timbers of the frame.
I therefore had full view of the frame timbers
& did work all fore & aft, —
