On the 29th December last a letter was forwarded from the London Office, stating the n^o of years character that was to be assigned to the Schooner now building at Arklow by Messrs Kearon & Sympson viz 11 years. Made up as follows 9 years as per Table A and one year mixed material.

Also adding that 1 year additional would be given if salted in accordance with Section 37 para 3-4

I forwarded a copy of the letter on to Arklow and have received a reply asking why their vessel is not to be allowed the 12 years Character

quoting Table A wherein it states that when a vessel is planked with Pitch pine from topside to top of keel the table gives 12. & 10 years. Character for pitch pine planking inside & outside and as she is to be planked of this Material both on the inside and outside with the exception of four plank at the turn of the bilge
