SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

ASHBURNE (s).—*Elsinore*, May 8, 10 46 a.m.—Ashburne, British steamer, Sunderland for Cronstadt, coal, foundered during a gale in middle of North Sea May 6. Part of crew saved and landed here by the British steamer Garnet; rest of crew taken off by a British fishing smack.
ASHBURNE (s).—*Sunderland*, May 8, 11 53 a.m.—Steamer Ashburne, of Sunderland, Brotherton master, which sailed hence for St. Petersburg on the 3rd instant, foundered on Sunday morning last in North Sea, 210 miles east of Tynemouth, during a heavy NW gale. Crew all saved and landed here this morning.—[See Elsinore paragraph.]
