Vessel reported by cable to have gone ashore at Santa Maria, Chili, on the 26th ultimo. The first report stated that the vessel was totally lost; the latest report describes her position as critical.

The owners write:—"We would ask you to be good enough to defer any action in the matter pending the receipt of further news from the Captain and the Underwriters' Agent, it being thought there may yet be a possibility of floating the vessel."

CAPE BRETON.—Concepcion, July 26, 10 20 a.m.—British ship Cape Breton, Swansea (coal), ashore Santa Maria; vessel and cargo totally lost. Crew saved in their own boats.
CAPE BRETON.—London, July 31.—The Salvage Association have received the following telegram from Lloyd's Agent, dated Concepcion (Chili), July 30:—"Cape Breton: The vessel when left was drifting towards the rocks. The vessel when left, it was thought, would not remain long afloat. Latest information: Rigging standing. Ashore in critical position. We recommend send able representative to make further inquiry, and report result by telegraph as soon as possible."—[See issue of July 27.]
