Dear Sir

"Indian Chief".

I am in receipt of your letter
of 31st regarding the loss of this vessel.
She sailed from Alloa on 3rd December
with a cargo of coals on my own account
bound for Barbadoes.

Her master reports that he experienced
the full force of the recent S.E. gales
in the North Sea and English Channel.
After clearing the English land while in a
gale of wind her rudder stock carried
away below the steering screw. Being un-
able to secure it through the bad weather
it carried away the braces and started
the stern post which caused the vessel
to make so much water that they were

obliged to abandon her.
The vessel was in every way in first class
order when she left Alcoa so much so that
I had very little insured on the vessel.
