Dear Sir,

R With reference to the s.s. "IMPOCO", which is reported to have gone ashore at Blond Island, off Yarmouth N.S. on 5th April last, and to have subsequently been refloated and taken to Halifax N.S., I am directed to say that the Committee will be much obliged if you will kindly favour them with the latest information which you have received as to the extent of damage, etc., and if you will be so good as to say also what course it is intended to pursue as regards the repair of the vessel.

The question of making a record of the casualty against the vessel's name in the Register Book will, in the ordinary course, shortly come under the Committee's notice, and it is the practice in cases where it is thought necessary to make such a notation, to expunge at the same time, the vessel's class from the Register Book. I shall be glad if you will kindly apprise me, for the Committee's information, of your views on this point.
