S. With reference to your enquiry regarding the motor vessel "MAZORCA", ex "Ekvator" ex "Tancarville", I can only refer you to the 1933/4 edition of the Society's Register Book, in which you will find the vessel was posted as a Casualty with the record: "In port damaged 12,33".

I would explain that in all cases where a casualty record is made against a vessel all reference to classification is automatically expunged.

As regards the request which has been made for a copy of the Surveyors reports to be furnished on the last occasion of a survey being held, I am directed to say that it would not be in accordance with the Committee's practice to furnish any information regarding a vessel, other than that published in the Society's Register Book, without the written consent of the actual Owner of the ship.
