## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**MIHERO.**—New York, Jan. 30.—A wireless message states that the tank steamer Mihero, from Matanzas, laden with molasses in bulk, broke in two and sank at sea. One boat with the chief officer and 17 men rescued, but another boat containing master and 22 men is still missing.—Reuter.

Washington, Jan. 31.—A wireless message announces that the steamer Sucrosa has saved the crew of the tank steamer Mihero, which was reported yesterday to have broken in two and to have sunk at sea.—Reuter.

**MIHERO.**—London, Feb. 2.—Following cable has been received from New York: Steamer Mihero reported abandoned Jan. 26; broken amidship.

**MIHERO.**—Charleston (S.C.), Feb. 2.—Destroyer Belknap and a naval tug returned to-day after two days' search for a boatload of survivors from steamer Mihero, which broke in two at sea. No sign of the boat was found along this coast.—New York Herald.
