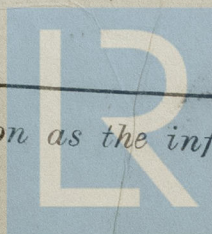

They understand however she was torpedoed and sunk by a German Submarine in the neighbourhood of the Bristol Channel about the 28th July 1918.
